Community Facilities Report

1 Introduction & Policy Context

The National Planning Policy Framework 2019 (NPPF)¹ defines community facilities as facilities such as local shops, meeting places, sports venues, open space, cultural buildings, public houses and places of worship. Policies should plan positively for the provision of these services, to help promote healthy and safe communities (para. 92).

The Wiltshire Core Strategy identifies community and health facilities in Melksham as under pressure, with most GP surgeries and primary and secondary schools at capacity (para 5.80). It includes the following key issues and considerations in relation to community facilities:

- 'Wherever possible, key community services and facilities should be located within or well related to the town centre to help promote and deliver the requisite regeneration. This should include consideration for how to best provide for the proposed new community campus for the town, which would offer a number of services and facilities, including leisure uses.'
- 'Developer contributions from future housing growth should help to deliver infrastructure necessary in the town. In particular, there is a need to increase the capacity of GP surgeries, particularly towards the west of the town. Additional cemetery capacity is also needed.' (para. 5.83). The expansion of Melksham cemetery is on Wiltshire Council's Regulation 123 List (meaning that it may be funded, in whole or in part, by Community Infrastructure Levy).

It should be noted that the proposed community campus is proposed for the whole Melksham Community Area, not just Melksham Town.

2 Community Facilities in Melksham Joint Neighbourhood Plan Area

Key Assets

There is a range of community facilities throughout the Melksham Neighbourhood Area, both within Melksham town and the settlements of Melksham Without. These facilities and services host and support a variety of community activity within the Neighbourhood Area.

The Neighbourhood Area is home to some highly valued community facilities, particularly its sports facilities (some of which are of regional importance) and Melksham Assembly Hall, (an important cultural facility for the local community). The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has also identified the high quality community centres and village halls within the area as a key positive asset.

Particularly within the rural settlements in Melksham Without, community activity is centred around key community hubs such as community centres or pubs; these are venues that are used for a range of different uses by a number of organisations. This is illustrated in Table 1 below.

Melksham Without Parish Council has put together comprehensive details on possible emergency rest centres in the parish. In some serious emergency situations such as flooding, fire or a bomb warning, the police may advise people to evacuate their homes. If this happens, the local council assisted by the voluntary organisations will set up a rest centre to look after evacuees who have nowhere else to stay.

Rest centres are usually set up in leisure centres, schools or church halls and provide a safe shelter for people until they are allowed to return to their homes or are provided with temporary accommodation.

As part of an Emergency Planning exercise, community facilities in the Plan area have been contacted to compile a list of possible rest centres with details of their capacity, facilities and contact details. Full details are included in Appendix 1.

Current gaps in provision of community facilities

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has identified a lack of theatre and cinema space in the Neighbourhood Area.

Funding from new housing developments is being provided to build a new village hall on Semington Road, in Berryfield, and also a new community centre, to be constructed for the residents in the newest part of Melksham, to the east.

At the time of writing, the community is awaiting the development of the new Community Campus. The Campus will be a hub for community services, and provide a new library, swimming pool, sports hall, gym, dance studio and meeting room, amongst other facilities. The Campus is planned as a hub for the whole Melksham Community Area, and it is predicted that the swimming pool will attract people from even further afield.

However, there have been delays to the delivery of this key future asset. A number of existing local facilities have closed and vacated their premises in order to move into the new campus, but as the campus is not yet developed, this has led to a gap in provision.

Future need for community facilities

As development and potential strategic allocation sites come forward in the Neighbourhood Area, it will be important to ensure that new facilities are provided so that the day to day needs of the increasing population can be met. This is particularly important for the provision of health care facilities, such as GP and dental surgeries, and schools (existing primary schools in the Neighbourhood Area are already oversubscribed). See Appendix 2 for more detail on health care provision in the area.

The capacity at the area's only secondary school, Melksham Oak, will start to exceed its current capacity by the academic year 2020 and by a larger amount in 2021. Although forecast numbers will rise slightly above the proposed capacity of 1500 between 2023 to 2026, by 2027/28 the school is expected to have 1500 pupils (figures from Melksham Oak Community School, 2019). Planning permission for an extension to the school was secured in October 2019.

This Report

The facilities and information listed within this report have been collated and researched by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group with help from their planning consultants. Despite this, the list cannot be said to be exhaustive (there are almost certainly more facilities than those listed below).





Appendix 2: Health Facilities

Access to local health facilities and services is a very high priority for local residents. The population's recent and expected future growth, caused by significant development in the Neighbourhood Area, is one of the main reasons for this.

The Wiltshire Health and Wellbeing Joint Strategic Needs Assessment Report 2017/18, which outlines current and projected need for health and wellbeing infrastructure in Wiltshire, used a projected population increase for the whole of Wiltshire which was surpassed by the actual population increase that occurred. This again highlights the importance of access to health facilities for the Melksham community.

Research carried out between 2015-2018 by the Neighbourhood Plan Health and Community Sub-Group indicated a shortfall in GP surgery staff.

Existing health facilities in Melksham Neighbourhood Area:

- Melksham Community Hospital
- Spa Medical Centre
- Market Place Dental
- Giffords Surgery
- St Damian's Surgery
- Regency Dental Practice
- Wiltshire Air Ambulance (Bowerhill)

However, it is understood that St. Damian's Surgery is due to close on 31st March 2020.

There is also a range of health and social care sessions and groups that run from various community facilities listed in this report, such as mental health support groups and

The Strategic Outline Case for Chippenham, Melksham and Trowbridge (NHS Clinical Wiltshire Commissioning Group, 2017) selects the preferred way forward for the re-provision of community and primary care services in the area. It sets the context and gives detail on existing facilities in the area. The following information is taken from this report.

There are 11 GP practices which support the local population of Chippenham, Melksham and Trowbridge.

Melksham Community Hospital

Melksham Community Hospital sits on a site of 3.53 hectares. It provides outpatient services including some specialised Wiltshire-wide services. The following services are delivered from Melksham:

- Children and Adolescent Mental Health (Oxford Health)
- Diabetes (Wiltshire Health and Care)
- Dietetics (Wiltshire Health and Care)
- Neurology specialists (Wiltshire Health and Care)
- Orthotics (Great Western Hospital)
- Pulmonary rehabilitation (Wiltshire Health and Care)
- Podiatry (Wiltshire Health and Care)
- Adult speech and Language therapy (Wiltshire Health and Care)
- Paediatric speech and Language therapy (Virgin Health)
- Tissue Viability (Wiltshire Health and Care)
